MNF working for unification of Zo tribes since 1961: Zoramthanga

Mizoram chief minister Zoramthanga on Tuesday said that the Mizo National Front (MNF) has been working for the unification of all Zo tribes for decades since 1961. Addressing the MNF block conference in Saitual, Zoramthanga said that he recently informed his Manipur counterpart N. Biren Singh that his party (MNF) has been spearheading a movement to integrate all the different tribes of the Zo community and to bring them under one administrative since 1961.

He said that the party is sustaining the movement till date.

He claimed that the MNF continue to grow despite several hardships on its way to progress.

"The MNF is firm on its motto- 'For God and My nation.' It is not due to the charismatic qualities of



the party leaders, but due to the grace of God that the party has been lifted up and continue to shine," Zoramthanga claimed.

Last month, Zoramthanga had said that unification of all ethnic Zo or Mizo tribes in India and bringing them under one administrative unit was one of the main objectives of the founders of the Mizo

National Front (MNF).

His statement came close on the heels of the demand made by 10 Kuki MLAs and the Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF) in Manipur for separate administration of the hill areas from the Manipur government.

In his address to party workers during a meeting at the party

office, Zoramthanga had said that the question of unification of Mizo inhabited areas of Mizoram's neighbouring states to form one administrative unit under the concept of Greater Mizoram was one of the demands of the Mizo National Front, and the issue was raised during the peace parleys with Indian Government.

The Centre then maintained that it could be done under article 3 of the Constitution of India, the MNF president had said.

He, however, said that Mizoram cannot directly interfere in the internal affairs of Manipur on the issue of 'Greater Mizoram' or unification of Mizoram's contiguous area in Manipur with the state.

"The that initiatives should come from 'our kindred brothers' in Manipur as the issue of unification of Chin-Kuki-Mizo-Hmar-Zomo tribes should not be imposed," Zoramthanga had said.

'BJP won't adopt appeasement, vote bank politics': PM Modi in poll-bound Madhya Pradesh

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has decided it would not adopt the path of appeasement and vote bank politics.

During his visit to Madhya Pradesh capital Bhopal, Modi was addressing BJP workers selected from across the country who have made effective contributions in empowering their booths under the party's 'Mera Booth Sabse Majboot' campaign.

"BJP's biggest power is its workers.

They have made the party the largest in the country. I thank JP Nadda for organising this event today through which I am able to virtually address around 10 lakh booth workers of the BJP virtually. No such virtual programme has ever taken place in the history of any political party," PM Modi said while interacting with BJP booth workers in Bhopal.

Party workers are BJP's biggest strength, Modi said, adding that Madhya Pradesh played a significant role in making the BJP the biggest party in the world.

"We don't sit in air-conditioned offices and issue diktats, we brave harsh

weather to be with people," PM Modi said to the BJP workers.

"The BJP has decided that it won't adopt the path of appeasement and vote bank," he said.

He also said those supporting triple talaq were doing grave injustice to Muslim daughters.

The PM further said the development of villages was a must for India to become a developed country.

Earlier in the day, PM flagged off five Vande Bharat Express trains from the Rani Kamalapati Railway Station in Madhya Pradesh's capital city Bhopal.

Manipur govt to invoke 'no work no pay' rule for employees

The Manipur government has decided to invoke 'no work, no pay' rule for its employees who are not attending office. The General Administration Department (GAD) has been asked to furnish details of employees who are not able to attend their official work due to the prevailing situation in the state.

A circular issued on Monday night by GAD Secretary Michael Achom said: "In pursuance of the meeting chaired by the Chief Minister on June 12 and decision taken at para 5-(12) of the proceedings, all employees drawing their salaries from General Administration Department, Manipur Secretariat are informed that no work, no pay may be invoked to all those employees who do not attend their official duty without authorised leave." Manipur government has one lakh employees.

The circular also asked for all administrative secretaries to furnish details of those employees who could not attend their official duty due to prevailing situation in the state indicating the details of employees such as designation, name, EIN, present address, to the General Administration Department and to the Personnel department, latest by June 28 so as to take appropriate necessary action. More than 100 people have lost their lives in the ethnic violence between Meitei and Kuki communities in the northeastern state so far. ACHIK Conscious Holistically Integrated Krima

The Achik Conscious Holistically Integrated Krima (ACHIK) today served a 7-day ultimatum to the Meghalaya government for immediate 'retrospective' implementation of the reservation roster.

In a statement, ACHIK President Thomas M Marak said, "Today, we are issuing an ultimatum to the Meghalaya Government, demanding immediate and decisive

action to implement the Roster System retrospectively in all public sector organizations, departments, and educational institutions."

"We humbly request that you respond to this ultimatum within 7 days from the date of this letter with a clear and actionable plan for the retrospective implementation of the Roster System. This response should outline the specific steps your government will take, along with a timeline for their execution," he

added. He said that failure to heed this ultimatum will have serious consequences for the government's reputation and the trust placed in it by the people.

Stating that the state government has a duty to rectify historical injustices and ensure equal opportunities for all citizens, Marak said the retrospective implementation of the Roster System is not a mere suggestion; it is a constitutional mandate that cannot be ignored.

Two Myanmar national held with heroin worth Rs. 1.33 cr

Two Myanmar nationals were arrested in Aizawl for possessing heroin worth Rs. 1.33 crore, Assam Rifles said in a statement.

Acting on a tip off, personnel of Assam Rifles in collaboration with the anti-narcotics squad of Mizoram excise and narcotics de-

partment carried out an operation at Thunpui area in Aizawl on Monday and seized 191 grams of heroin from the possession of the two peddlers, the statement said. The seized heroin was concealed in 15 soap cases, it said. Both the accused and the seized contraband were handed over to the state excise and narcotics department for further legal proceedings, the statement added.

In another operation, the Assam Rifles and Customs department also seized smuggled foreign liquor worth Rs. 88.98 lakh at Zokhawthar on the Mizoram-Myanmar border on Monday.

Manipur CM offers Rs 1000 relief to victims of violence staying in camps

This financial assistance will be given so that the inmates can buy clothing and personal belongings, Singh said at a relief camp in the Khuman Lampak Sports Complex in Imphal East district, where 106 women and children are staying.

Around 50,000 people are now staying in over 300 relief camps across the state since the violence started early last month.

"The government has decided to give Rs 1000 to those staying in the relief camps. The financial assistance will be given through the respective district authorities," the chief minister told reporters.

Singh also visited a relief camp Lamphelpat in Imphal West district and interacted with the inmates.

"The state government is committed to assist the affected people and providing basic needs to the victims. Extended financial aid & assistance as a part of the ongoing measures to provide relief and rehabilitation to the displaced persons," he tweeted later.

Stating that what has happened in the state is "very unfortunate", Singh told reporters that relentless efforts of various groups including women's organisations besides the state machinery have helped the situation improve a lot.



Singh said the Centre is monitoring the situation in the state round the clock and the state machinery is working to provide support to all.

"Some 40,000 security personnel were deployed at vulnerable areas where militants have the potential to attack," he said. Singh said that during his visit to New Delhi on Sunday, Union Home Minister Amit Shah has assured him that the Centre will look into the militant activities prevalent in the hill areas.

The chief minister said he had also informed Shah that the state government is working hard to make sure that there is no unrest in the valley areas.

"The government is working hard to

provide settlement for those displaced in the aftermath of the violence," he said.

Singh had said last week that his government will build 3,000-4,000 pre-fabricated houses to accommodate people who had to flee from their houses during the ongoing violence in the northeastern state.

"Construction for providing settlement to displaced individuals from Imphal East including Ikou area has already commenced near Sajiwa jail. Efforts are on to inaugurate it within 10 weeks and accordingly shift the displaced individuals there.

"For those displaced from Churachandpur district, temporary settlement will be built at Kwakta in Bishnupur district. When the situation improves, all the displaced will once again return to their respective places," the chief minister said. More than 100 people have lost their lives in the ethnic violence between Meitei and Kuki communities in the northeastern state so far. Clashes first broke out on May 3 after a 'tribal solidarity march' was organised in the hill districts to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status.

Meiteis account for about 53 per cent of Manipur's population and live mostly in the Imphal Valley. Tribals -- Nagas and Kukis -- constitute another 40 per cent of the population and reside in the hill districts.
